Cllr Norman Work's Report for July 2018 meeting

I attended the QHS senior show on Monday 25th June. Another great performance from the houses.

The Lord Provost asked me as a Bailie to welcome the inaugural visit of Cruise Liner MSC Meravoglia to Queensferry and to exchange plaques on Tuesday 26th June. This gave me the opportunity to promote the town of Queensferry to the Captain & Crew. It also gave me the opportunity to speak to the welcoming volunteers and view the operations at first hand.

I met with Gordon Muir who is trying to get support for his idea of a Burryman sculpture and I suggested he also met with QDCC & the current Burryman Andrew Taylor to gain further support. This is in its early stages and I will keep QDCC updated as I'm sure Keith will.

I have had a quieter than normal month in relation to local issues due to the council recess and being out of the country representing the Lord Provost at McCrae's Battalion Trust annual pilgrimage to Contalmaison in France in the early part of July and then on holiday up north later in July.

The Finance and Resources Committee will meet on 16 August to consider a report to approve a lease of approximately 0.875 hectares (0.216 acres) at Port Edgar Marina to South Queensferry Sea Cadets. The rent will be £2,500 per annum and the lease will expire in 2084.

Garden waste registration deadline extended to 5pm 24 July
