### Cllr Norman Work's report for November 2018 meeting

I attended a Christmas in Queensferry meeting in the Rosebery Hall on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> November where the final arrangements were being organised for the light switch on event on 30<sup>th</sup> November. The Committee have decided to encourage more input from young people in conjunction with the Scottish Government's Year of the Young People theme.

I attended the Remembrance service in Queensferry on Armistice Sunday and laid a wreath on behalf of the City of Edinburgh Council. A very good turnout including representatives from all the youth organisations.

North West Locality meeting took place on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> November in the City Chambers. One item which took up a large amount of time was where councillors had the opportunity to ask questions to the head of Waste Services Andy Hunter about the missed bin uplifts.

I reported several street light failures in and around Queensferry High Street after being contacted by members of Christmas in Queensferry.

I was asked to chase up a missing bus stop timetable at the bus stop outside Queensferry Primary School on Burgess Road and to find out what the delay is for the replacement bus shelter on Scotstoun Avenue at Sommerville Gardens.

Patrick Coogan has published proposals for parking restrictions around Dalmeny Station including introducing a one way system for the car park.

Results of the Queensferry & Kirkliston traffic survey will be discussed at a meeting arranged soon.

I've been asked to find out more information about the Golden Share Scheme, part of the affordable housing in the Dalmeny Park development.

I was contacted by several residents in Dalmeny Park concerned about the planning application for the commercial property. Many were concerned that they were not aware that the building would be more than one storey and would take away parking which is used by residents.
