### Cllr Norman Work's report for March 2019 meeting

Thanks to David Flint & David Steel for highlighting missed bus stop timetable information at two bus stops at the Police Station & Burges Road. The timetables have been installed.

Pot holes, I reported several pot holes, one which seemed to just appear at the Pedestrian Crossing on Kirkliston Road at Rosebery Avenue & two pot holes on William Black Place were also reported.

TRO's for parking restrictions have been advertised around Hopetoun Crossroads and streets leading off and Rosshill Terrace and around the new bus terminus.

On Sunday March 10<sup>th</sup> I took part in the Pool competition at Stags Head Hotel in aid of Queensferry Care. Although I did not advance past the first round QCCC are £300 better off after the fundraising event which was very well attended. Well done to all involved.

The street light on Newhalls Road next to Bikers Cove has finally been fixed. The cause for the delay was internal wiring which needed to be replaced.

I attended the latest meeting on the High Street refurbishment meeting, Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> March at Burgh Chambers where the option to have a oneway system seems to be the favourite. This will include a contraflow system for cyclists and traffic light system at The Loan/Hopetoun Road. Also plans to improve the area around the Hawes car park. A further meeting is planned soon with further public consultation due in April.

Taylor Wimpey have now suggested adding further housing to the southern section of the development by up to 47 additional homes within the land to the south east of the whole development and just south of Dimma park. This section has already had approval for 33 homes, it is an additional up to 47 more homes that is being proposed following release of further land by Transport Scotland. There will be a public exhibition held by Taylor Wimpey of the plans between 4-7pm on 30 April at the Queensferry Community Centre, just off Kirkliston Road.

Sewer works in High Street; This has taken a lot longer than first envisaged however Scottish Water have been providing detailed updates to councillors but also residents & businesses affected.
