Cllr Norman Work's report for May 2019 meeting.

Along with Keith Giblett & Graeme McKinley, I attended the launch of the Forth Bridges Tourism Strategy in North Queensferry on Tuesday 24th April.

I attended the latest High Street Consultation event on 29th April at the Burgh Chambers and again it was well attended by residents which gave me the opportunity to listen to their views on the option presented.

On Tuesday 30th April, along with Keith Giblett, I attended a meeting I organised between the Street Lighting Team & Christmas in Queensferry in relation to the Energy Efficient Street Lighting Programme which is taking place in the High Street area before August. The meeting was to discuss how the options for the connection of Christmas Lights to the street lighting apparatus can be implemented. A further meeting is planned on Wednesday 29th May.

I spoke to the manager of Scotmid on The Loan after receiving complaints about parked cars blocking the entrance to the path. I asked that lines or markings were painted on the space to deter drivers from parking their cars in that space. I also moved the traffic cone back in front of the parking space which had been moved to the side & asked that the cone or barriers are kept placed over the space meanwhile and monitored.

I attended a meeting of what is now described as the former Almond Neighbourhood Partnership on Wednesday 8th May at the Drumbrae Hub. Main item was to discuss grant allocations and NEP projects. Queensferry Memorial Pipe Band, The Ferry Fair were successful in grants they had applied for.

I attended the Port Edgar open weekend on Saturday Sat 11th May. Another very successful event helped no doubt by the fantastic weather. In the evening I attended the Queensferry Rugby Football Club's awards evening. Allan Carson is stepping down as President of QRFC being replaced by Chris Keenan. Allan will still be involved with QRFC but in a more relaxed capacity while he concentrates more on the Hub itself.
