Almond Community Policing Team

The Community Policing Team (previously known as Safer Neighbourhood Team) took up residence at South Queensferry Police Station on 21st September 2010.

The team is led by Inspector John Cooper and Sergeant Derek Duff.

The team consists of 7 Community Facing Constables and the emphasis will be on Partnership working in a bid to solve local issues. Our principal partners will be those living and working in the Almond Ward and the City of Edinburgh Council.
