CORRESPONDENCE SECRETARY REPORT – JUNE 2016

1. Little change in terms of e-mail correspondence to and from QDCC since the last meeting
Main contributors continue to be related to the various planning applications/developments across the Burgh – Builyeon Road in particular and more recently Craigiehall village, some queries relating to the announcement on the delayed opening of the Queensferry Crossing and proposed renovation of the High Street. Other topics of discussion have been the ongoing roadworks on B800 and the Tesco supplies entrance and Scotrail train strikes.
There have also been a couple of queries on the Lovers Lane Stopping Up order outcome.

As per previous months others were related to various ongoing parking and traffic matters, dog fouling, overflowing waste bins and the general state of roads and pavements in a number of locations across the town.

We continue to receive a large number of mails from CEC on various topics which are circulated to Councillors as and where applicable.

QDCC has received 3 “Contact Us Submissions” through the website since the last meeting.

- Scottish Lanfdill Communities Fund
- Behavior of Traffic Wardens
- Query regarding issue of blue badge (Queensferry North Wales)

2. No significant postal correspondence was received in the period since the last meeting
3. Facebook continues to be a major communication tool for QDCC and we now boast over 1970 followers.
Facebook communication and enquiries broadly match those received by e-mail but in greater volume.

More specific topics include housing queries, public transport queries- especially the proposed timetable changes on the 40/40A route by Stagecoach and recent Scotrail train strikes as well as ongoing posts related to LDP2, planning applications (Builyeon Road & Craigiehall Village) and current developments at Dalmeny Park and Ferrymuir.

We continue to field many queries from local residents through our Facebook pages. Thanks to Diane, Grant and Laura for responding to these on behalf of QDCC.

Just a reminder to all Councillors that the QDCC website is also active, requires constant administration and I would once again encourage all members to have a look and again welcome any suggestions for materials to post. 4. On behalf of QDCC this month I have written and responded to CEC officials, CEC Councillors and a number of local residents on various community issues.
5. In February I wrote to Andrew Kerr (CEO of CEC) on the unsatisfactory situation regarding domestic waste uplifts. Following an initial exchange of information I contacted the office again for an update. I continue to wait for a response.
6. Previously I had written to the Planning and Environmental Appeals Division (DPEA) of the Scottish Government relating to the Stopping Up Order on Lovers Lane. QDCC did not receive formal notification on the decision.
7. I attended a meeting on 6th June with Alex Cole–Hamilton MSP and his agent and prospective Council Lib-Dem candidate Kevin Lang. Details outlined in Chairs report
8. On 23rd June I attended a meeting with Rick Finc Associates and Hallam Land management on Craigiehall Village development. See Chairs report for background
9. I continue to distribute information to office-bearers, members and/or portfolio conveners as appropriate.
